Thomas Jeffereson

Author of the declaration of independence and third president of the U.S.

Alexander Hamilton

Federalist who created the first National Bank.

John Jay

Author of many Federalist papers and supporter of the new Constitution.

Edmond Randolph

Proposed the Virginia plan creating a strong national government favoring large states with large populations.

James Madison

Known as the father of the Constitution.

The Constitution

Written form of government we still operate under today.

Federalist

Supporters of the new Constitution.

Antifederalist

Those opposed to adopting the new constitution.

sovereignty

Having power over something i.e. government

popular sovereignty

Government by the consent of the governed (Authority of the people.)

bicameral two houses (parts) A voluntary association of confederation independent states. To approve of something. ratify ordinance a law

Daniel Shays

Formal army soldier (war veteran) who leads a rebellion against unfair taxation.

Roger Sherman

Proposed the Connecticut Compromise creating a bicameral congress based on equality and population.

federalism

Sharing of power between national(federal) and state governments.

checks and balances

The ability of each branch of government to check the power of the other to ensure no one branch of government is too powerful.

republicanism

People have the power to choose their representatives in government.

enumerated powers

Powers specifically dedicated to the federal (national) government.

concurrent powers

Powers shared by both federal and state governments.

reserved powers

Powers that are held by the state governments
