partisan

Favoring one side of an issue.

Federalists

Those who were in favor of
the Constitution and
supported Washington's
policies.

Democratic-Republicans

Those in favor of a limited government.

Alien and Sedition Acts

A series of acts passed by federalists to silence the republican opposition.

Thomas Jefferson

Third president of the U.S. and leader of the Democratic-Republican party

James Madison

Democratic-Republican who believed in a strict interpretation of the Constitution.

James Monroe

5th president of the U.S.
bringing hope and optimism
after the War of 1812.

Tecumseh

Native American chief who
created an American Indian
confederacy that sought support
from Britain and Canada.

nationalism

Loyalty to one's own country
(patriotism.)

laissez-faire

French philosophy of let
people do as they choose.
(Government stay out!)

John Marshall

Chief Justice of the Supreme Court during Marbury v. Madison.

Marbury v. Madison

Court case establishing the concept of Judicial Review.

Judicial Review

The Constitution is the supreme law of the land and the Judicial branch must uphold the Constitution when examining government laws.

Louisiana Purchase

Land purchased from France doubling the size of the U.S.

Lewis and Clark

Explorers of the Louisiana Territory.

Sacagewea

Guide to Lewis and Clark on their exploration.

disarmament

Laying down of weapons and stopping of a war or fighting.

impressment

Capturing of American sailors and forcing them to serve in the British navy.

embargo

Prohibits trade with foreign nations.

War Hawks

Those in favor of going to war (with Britain.)

Monroe Doctrine

Declared North America a world power equal to any European nations at the time.

nullify

Legally overturn a law if found unconstitutional by the states.
