Database	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Name of the article you used.2. Name of the database.3. Online.	Tigers. <i>PebbleGo</i> . Online.
Internet	<ol style="list-style-type: none">1. Title of the information you used.2. Name of the website, italicized.3. URL (website address).	Abraham Lincoln. <i>The White House</i> . <www.whitehouse.gov>.
